

EMS Academy Conduct Standards

I understand that the following behaviors are unacceptable, and that engaging in any of them constitutes grounds for dismissal from the EMS Academy program. In the event that a participant is dismissed from the program, participant will not be entitled to a refund of any monies paid for or in connection with this program. The Medical Director and course coordinator may dismiss participant at their discretion based on misconduct, unethical or immoral behavior.

The following are grounds for dismissal action:

- **Repeated Tardiness** – Reporting late to class or clinical.
- **Use of Abusive, Profane, or Obscene Language or Gestures**
- **Unauthorized Absence from Class or Clinical Rotations**
- **Cellular telephone** may be brought to class, but *must* be kept on vibrate. **All** calls are to be made or taken at break or lunch. **NO EXCEPTIONS**
- **Stealing** – Any intentional unlawful taking and/or carrying away of property belonging to, or in the lawful possession or custody of another's, including property belonging to Medical College of College, or other institutions and or student belongings.
- **Possession of Stolen Property**
- Maintain honesty and integrity in all issues regarding coursework and interaction with school officials
- Obey all campus rules
- **Sexual Harassment** - Of any type will not be tolerated.
- **False Information** – Intentionally providing false information. This includes, but is not limited to, forgery of documentation required to attend the courses offered through the EMS Academy, such as certification or license, information required to obtain a background checks for attendance to clinical sites.
- **Unauthorized Use of Instructional Technology**
 - Any attempt to bypass whether successful or not, security and system controls, including e-mail, chats, bulletin boards, and messaging
 - Any installation of personal or copyrighted software
 - Any use of technology for personal gain, profit, or any illegal conduct, such as fraud, copyright infringement, pornography, hacking, or distributing viruses that result in minor disruptions
- Violation of MCG or other institutions rules and regulations or state laws.
- Actions or threats of action harmful to other persons or actions harmful to property.
- Dishonesty, including, but not limited to, cheating, plagiarism or knowingly furnishing false information to the college.
- Forgery, alteration, misrepresentation or misuse of college documents, records or identification.
- Obstruction or disruption of teaching, research, administration, disciplinary procedures or other college activities, including, but not limited to, its community services functions, or of other authorized activities on or off college premises.
- Unauthorized entry to, or use of, college materials, supplies, equipment and/or facilities.
- Medical College of Georgia campus police requires that a background check be conducted on all participants who attend any program held at the Medical College of Georgia. Any participant who does not meet the standards held by the campus police will be asked to withdraw from the program they are attending.

I have read the above rules of conduct and agree to abide by the rules as outlined above. If any of these rules are broken, I agree to any consequences associated with breaking these rules. Further I understand any misconduct could jeopardize my opportunity to attend other course through Medical College of Georgia and /or other institution.
