This list is based on the Basic Generalist Competencies noted in the MCG Core Medicine Clerkship Curriculum guide (1998).

Many students have found it useful to assess what they have learned up to this point and to ascertain which skills they would still like to develop. Take a few minutes to rate your mastery of the competencies using the following scale:

- 0 = No experience, skill or competence
- 1 = Some experience, but still require supervision
- 2 = Much experience, require little supervision.
