

CHILD PSYCHIATRY EVALUATION ISSUES AND PROCEDURES

1. Each child resident will be evaluated and recorded on appropriate forms in One45 (electronic evaluation system):
 - a. At the end of your rotation a 360 evaluation form will be sent to various nursing or unit clerks through One45 to evaluate your performance on the rotation.
 - b. For supervisors there will be a mid-point evaluation completed every three months with a final evaluation completed on your performance at the end of the rotation.
 - c. Every six months with Training Director (a statement based on composite competency evaluations from faculty consensus).
2. In the Spring, an oral examination evaluating clinical competence will be required of all child residents. The format will approximate the examination of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. The resident's performance in this examination will be a component of overall faculty evaluation.
3. Child Residents are required to take the CHILD PRITE examination when it is offered each year. Residents who score less than 30% (national scale) will take part in remedial efforts to improve cognitive knowledge base.

RESIDENT EVALUATION OF FACULTY, ROTATIONS AND COURSES

Residents will be asked to evaluate rotations, seminars at end of each rotation through One45.
